

Comments Suspect Chew was the horse trainer during the filming of the television series, "Luck"; suspect Agnic was the veterinarian responsible for the physical welfare of horses used during filming. The American Humane Association (AHA) was hired to enforce the animal cruelty laws and ensure that horses used during filming of the series were well cared for and not mistreated or overworked. AHA reps indicated in reports that they believed horses were sedated and/or possibly given drugs to mask pain caused by previous injuries in order to allow them to perform, but there was no actual evidence presented to support those suspicions. An AHA rep(s) also indicated in AHA reports that at least one horse used during the filming appeared to have been very underweight, however, no evidence was presented to prove: 1 - the cause of the horse's condition; 2 - that the horse's condition was a result of a criminal act; 3 - who (or what) was responsible for the horse's condition. While various observations made by AHA reps give rise to a suspicion that horses may have been improperly cared for, there is insufficient evidence to prove a criminal case BRD.
